*From the Lord's Prayer, "Hallowed be Your name," we want a lifestyle that hallows God.*

3. I live a consecrated life to God.

*From 1 Peter 1:16, "Be holy because I'm holy," using "consecrated" as set apart, like tabernacle utensils in Exodus 40:9-11.*

4. I am patient and kind.

*From 1 Corinthians 13:4, love is patient and kind; when patience runs out, kindness often follows.*

5. I do not brag. I am not arrogant. I do not behave unbecomingly. I do not demand my own way. I'm not easily angered. I keep no record of wrongs.

*From 1 Corinthians 13:4-5, actions rising from love; keeping a record of wrongs means thinking of what others did to us.*

6. I do not rejoice about injustice, but I rejoice whenever the truth wins out.

*From 1 Corinthians 13:6, love does not rejoice in injustice but with the truth.*

7. I never give up. I never lose faith. I'm always hopeful, and I endure through every circumstance.  
*From 1 Corinthians 13:7, love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things; love is actions, not feelings.*

8. I am ready to act on what God is indicating.  
*From Mark 12:29, "Shema Israel," meaning hear and act; like John 10:27, sheep hear and follow.*

9. My thought life reflects my covenant commitment to Christ.  
*From Mark 12:30, love God with all your mind; part of the greatest commandment.*

10. My feelings and their subsequent actions reflect my covenant commitment to Christ.  
*From Mark 12:30, love God with all your heart and soul; feelings lead to actions.*

11. My body and what I do with it reflect my covenant commitment to Christ.  
*From Mark 12:30, love God with all your strength; what I do with my body.*

12. I treat others the way I want to be treated.  
*From Mark 12:31, love your neighbor as yourself; the second greatest commandment.*

13. I love others the way Christ loves me.

*From John 13:34-35, a new commandment to love one another as I have loved you.*

14. I am quick to forgive.

*From Matthew 6:12,14-15 in the Lord's Prayer, about forgiving others.*

15. I do not lead myself into temptation.

*From Matthew 6:13 in the Lord's Prayer, pray not to be led into temptation, so don't lead ourselves.*

16. I am willing to ask others for help.

*From James 4:2, we have not because we ask not; God may intend things through others' help, avoid regret.*

17. My knowledge of the word of God is growing and my application of the word of God is improving.

*Worship in truth; mature in interpreting the word, as Jesus asked, "What is written in the law and how are you interpreting it?"*

18. My handling of the things of the spirit is maturing.

*Worship in spirit; from Zechariah 4:6, not by might nor power but by my spirit; mature alongside knowledge of the word.*
